

Days are starting to get shorter and nights cooler. That must mean that it is time to get ready to hit the slopes. The Chicago Metropolitan Ski Council and its member clubs have spent the summer planning great trips for this winter. But that isn't all we do to support winter sports.

American Blind Skiing Foundation held a very successful fundraising event this June. They put on a pig roast and dance. Many ski club members and friends attended and had several ways to help support ABSF. There were silent auctions and raffles that both local businesses and industry partners generously donated to. You could also adopt a skier and as always there was a split-the-pot.

SouthEastern Wisconsin Adaptive Ski Program asked for help when they needed to replace a worn out monoski for use in their lessons. The CMSC challenged clubs and their members to match up to \$2,000 and were pleasantly surprised to find that as of September \$2,400 was donated so SEWASP can not only purchase the new monoski, but also extra outriggers.

Another program we like to support is the Norge Ski Training Program, which is part of Norge Ski Club. They have members on the new Fly Girls developmental team for women's ski jumping. There are also several on the Junior National Team and Men's National Team. Some of the ways they finance the program are raffles, wine dinners and tournaments. This October was their 30th Autumn Ski Jump and in January they will hold their 111th annual Winter Ski Jump.

WINTER FROLICS IN VERMONT

Amenity-laden
resorts and New
England charm lure
ski and snowboard
groups to the Green
Mountain State

"Welcome to Vermont" reads the friendly sign. You just passed into the Green Mountain State and are driving along a two-lane road and are surrounded by snow-capped pines and outlines of wintery mountains backed by crisp blue skies. Something is different about Vermont, you notice. No flashy billboards blind you from the natural beauty and as you pass through a small town with an old-timey general store and tall church steeple at the center, you get the sense that life has slowed down and you're far removed from your worries and work commitments. The charm of Vermont's landscape, towns and people have pulled you in, just as the promise for great skiing and snowboarding led you there.

Steeped in ski and snowboard history, Vermont has something not all other winter destinations have: a deep sense of snowsports culture and community dating back to the early 1900s. Home to the first rope tow erected in 1934 at Gilbert's Hill in Woodstock, the birthplace of the National Ski Patrol and the first Nordic Center started by the famous Trapp family, Vermont is a destination like no other. While the ski resorts dotting the Vermont map vary from luxurious to budget and from challenging to family-friendly, you'll always find a smiling face and a friendly community ready to receive you.





Athletic Prowess and Learning to Ski or Snowboard in Vermont

Vermont produces more US Winter Olympians per capita than any other state by a long shot. Nineteen athletes with Vermont ties made their way to Sochi in February 2014 to compete for their country. That said, it's not only the number of Olympians from Vermont that is impressive, it's the quality. Six Vermont athletes took home medals from the 2014 Olympic games in Sochi. That is six out of 28 total medals for the USA, meaning 21% of the winning athletes have Vermont roots. Not bad for a little New England state of only 625,000 inhabitants.

A breeding ground for top competitors, Vermont is also a great place to learn to ski or snowboard for the first time. Professional lessons are available at all resorts and special packages from resorts give great incentives to keep learning, like a free pair of skis or a season pass. Kids and parents can also be instructed by an Olympian at Cochran's Ski Area. Gold medalist Barbara Ann Cochran runs a Ski Tots program for those as young as three years old.

What's New at Vermont Ski and Snowboard Resorts

With some of the tallest peaks in the area and favorable weather patterns, you won't find better snow on the East Coast. That said, Vermont resorts are so intent on delivering a quality experience that they upgraded their snowmaking systems last season with over 2,300 new low-energy snow guns, a \$15-million investment. The new statewide snowmaking upgrade means better snow with less energy and the ability to blow snow at higher temperatures leading to longer seasons.

Vermont resorts also invested in upgrading uphill transportation. New in 2015 is Okemo's Sunburst Six lift, a new, high-speed, six-person bubble chairlift with heated seats – the first of its kind in North America. Stratton Mountain Resort introduced 58 new gondola cabins for a more comfortable ride to the top of southern Vermont's highest peak, and Stowe Mountain Resort completely renovated its famous summit gondola on Mt. Mansfield and improved family lift service on lower Spruce Peak with a new quad chairlift and two new carpet surface lifts.

HOW TO GET TO VERMONT


asy drives, reliable trains, direct flights and chartered bus services make traveling to Vermont's renowned ski areas a snap. In fact, winter in Vermont welcomes seven times the state's population in visitors seeking mountain vacations for adventure, relaxation and rejuvenation.

By Auto: Vermont resorts are a convenient drive from anywhere in the East. Interstates 89, 91 and Vermont Route 100, the fabled skiers' highway, provide direct access to the mountains and villages. Vermont Transit, part of the Greyhound system, connects Vermont communities with Boston, Montreal and New York daily.

By Plane: With excellent air service, Burlington International Airport is a convenient point of access to northern and central Vermont resorts. Major air carriers include JetBlue, United, American and Delta.

Visitors to central and southern resorts can fly to Albany, Boston, Hartford, Manchester, New Hampshire and Rutland, Vermont. Rental cars are available at all airports, and many resorts offer ground transportation.

By Train: Two Amtrak routes operate between Washington, D.C., Philadelphia, New York City and Vermont, providing daily passenger service to many of Vermont's mountain communities.



Killington's Peak Lodge facility opened its doors at the 4,100-foot level of Killington Peak in December 2013, replacing the original structure from the late 1960s. The new 15,000-square-foot facility includes seating for 300 quests, a food venue featuring a selection of fresh local fare, a full bar, and lounge areas with couches and coffee tables. Like the K-1 Express Gondola, the Peak Lodge sources its electricity via Green Mountain Power's innovative Cow Power program. *

VOLCANIC CONFLUENCE CHICAGO WEEK 2015, Feb. 21-28 MT. BACHELOR, OREGON

ith a theme of "Volcanic Confluence," good times erupted at Chicago Week last winter. Mt. Bachelor, the 2015 venue for CMSC's annual ski party, is a stratovolcano, part of the Cascades Mountain range. It sits in the Deschutes National Forest and boasts a lot of varied skiing with few lift lines. Our group stayed at Sunriver, a year-round resort community of homes, condos, meeting space, and a village mall. Both Sunriver and Mt. B are about 20 minutes from each other and the lively town of Bend, Oregon.

Though it wasn't the Northwest's best snow year, everyone noticed Mt. Bachelor's great grooming. We enjoyed sunshine most of the week and a day of powder for the finale. Many folks took advantage of alternative activities: snowshoeing, Nordic skiing, dogsledding and lava cave tours.

This year's CW comprised 124 people from 12 CMSC clubs: Club 400, Chicagoland Club 50, Duneland, Fleetwind, Hustlers, Inland, Joliet, Nomad, Omaha, Piccadilly, Sitzmark (Chicago) and Skunk Hollow. The clubs flew into Portland with a few individuals choosing to fly into Redmond.

Upon arrival at Sunriver on Saturday night, folks dropped luggage at their condos before quickly heading off to get this party started. The first event in CMSC's week-long luau was a buffet dinner at Sunriver's massive and historic Great Hall. Leis were handed out and everyone enjoyed a relaxed evening after a long day of travel.

Sunday morning we had our first Chicago Week breakfast buffet. This daily event became the place to meet your friends before the ski day started. Sunday night was our first Bend Night. Some people strolled Bend's downtown and dined, while others took part in that cherished Chicago Week tradition, the Pub Crawl, with its challenging Trivia Scavenger Hunt. Teams of four visited a quartet of local drinking establishments seeking answers to life's persistent questions such as "How many eyes DOES the peacock have?"

In keeping with the week's volcanic island theme, we enjoyed Monday's group lunch in Mt. Bachelor's base lodge Caldera Room, decorated in full Hawaiian style. That evening we bused to Bend's unique High Desert Museum for dinner and drinks, music, exhibit tours and a live presentation with a peregrine falcon.

Tuesday afternoon's Fun Race was followed by an après-ski at mid-mountain Pine Marten Lodge, offering spectacular views from the deck. The party ended with a private CW "Last Tracks" to the base. That evening CWers enjoyed club events, dining in Sunriver Village and the CMSC Hospitality Suite at Sunriver Lodge.









CMSC's annual Chicago Week winter getaway took on the tropical trappings of sun-kissed Hawaii at Oregon's Sunriver resort community.

On Wednesday, 54 people filled five buses for a trip to Crater Lake National Park, about two hours away. The guided excursion included lunch and snowshoeing near the lake's rim, and got rave reviews. Other folks used that day to relax at Sunriver or skied again at the mountain. Wednesday evening was Bend Night #2. Buses again ferried people downtown to dine, listen to music at McMenamin's Old St Francis School or enjoy libations at the Dogwood Cocktail Cabin, our new "local" bar.

Thursday night was the culmination of our Volcanic Confluence. Everyone flaunted colorful Hawaiian garb at the Great Lodge for the Dinner Banquet. The evening's entertainment started with slack key guitar music followed by a fantastic Polynesian floor show featuring a traditional native Hawaiian band, more than 20 dancers and numerous costume changes. In addition, there were the usual door prizes, slide show of the week's activities and a preview of the next Chicago Week (Whistler in 2016).

On Friday, Mt. Bachelor got 6-8 inches of new snow, a nice treat for our last day. That evening was a final opportunity for Sunriver Village dining and the CW Hospitality Suite.

CMSC'S EUROPEAN SKI TRIP TO

MAYRHOFEN, AUSTRIA AND PRAGUE, CZECH REPUBLIC

ast season's European ski trip was to Mayrhofen, an idyllic Austrian ski town in the Zillertal Valley, 40 km. east of Innsbruck, in the heart of Tyrol. Besides the large lift interconnected ski areas at Mayrhofen, there are four other major ski areas in the valley, all on the same lift ticket, including the

Hintertux Glacier, which is open for skiing year round. Mayrhofen is a great destination resort for skiers of all abilities with many long runs, huts along the way, and interconnected ski runs to other towns and villages for the true spirit of European skiing.

Our group of 48 skiers from 15 clubs in the council departed on a SWISS flight from O'Hare to Zurich, Switzerland on January 23, 2014. We flew SWISS not only for their great service and comfort, but also because SWISS did not charge a baggage fee for skis.

After a scenic bus ride to Mayrhofen, we checked into the wonderful 3-Star Hotel Brucke, conveniently located near the lifts and the bus stops. Meals in the hotel were extraordinary. The very large breakfast buffets had many hot and cold items. Dinners included a buffet of appetizers, salad bar and two soups. A choice was given for the main course, and there was a hot and cold dessert buffet with three flavors of ice cream. Our hosts, Familie Schneeberger, were very friendly and helpful.

The weather during the week was mixed. Two days we couldn't

see anything, two days we could see a little and two days were sunny. A number of us stayed together and skied four of the five major areas in six days, including the infamous Ski Route 30, an ungroomed, un-skied, 3,900-foot vertical drop ski run through the trees, down to a major gondola station, east of Mayrhofen. Others did their own thing skiing and sightseeing around the town and the area. One group went to Innsbruck for the day by train. Two of the evenings, the group gathered in the hotel bar for a "happy hour" before dinner.

Saturday morning, at Zurich airport, four people departed on a Swiss flight for home, and 44 people took a SWISS flight to Prague, Czech Republic for our "optional" 3-day extension. After arrival, we traveled on a guided sight-seeing bus for a city tour on the way to the hotel. Our hotel, the 4-Star Falkensteiner Maria, was Old World architecture outside, but modern inside with large comfortable rooms.

The people at the front desk were very friendly, knowledgeable and helpful.

Sunday morning after a huge and varied buffet breakfast (included with the hotel), we took a guided sightseeing bus up the hill to the Prague Castle and the start of a fantastic guided walking tour down to the famous Charles Bridge, and across it into town and the Main Square. Evenings were spent trying to locate a "special restaurant" for dinner. Monday, people spent the day revisiting places or looking for new ones.

Prague is a very beautiful, clean, walkable Old World city with fabulous architecture, sculptures, friendly people and great restaurants. Everyone said three days was not enough time there. I know many will be looking forward to another extension to this fabulous city.


This has been a very busy Summer for our commitee, with lots of improvements for this upcoming race season.




