

My Advice? Join a Snowboard and Ski Club

Okay, you've picked up this magazine and started reading this article, so you're either (a) a skier/snowboarder or (b) really bored. If you fall into the first category and dream about snow covered runs under clear blue skies, then

keep reading. If you're just bored you might want to move onto another magazine or, better yet, keep reading. There's nothing boring about skiing and snowboarding.

Apparently you've managed to discover that skiing and snow-boarding are collectively a great individual sport that beats hibernation as a winter activity. What you might not have discovered is the phenomenal social aspect of the sport, which can easily be experienced by hitting the slopes with a snowboard and ski club. These clubs typically can vary by age, ethnicity, employer, regional location or other favorite hobby, and the Midwest region of the US has a wide variety of clubs to choose from. The Chicago Metropolitan Ski Council is an umbrella organization for over 80 snowboard and ski clubs in Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska and Wisconsin, and the pages of this magazine or our website can be helpful in locating the right club for you.

Don't think these clubs limit their activities to the three or four few months each year that the snow falls. Most of the clubs are active all twelve months, taking part in other activities such as bicycling, camping, canoeing, cruises, golf, softball leagues, tennis outings, volleyball tournaments, etc. After all, skiers and snowboarders are active people, and active people are active all year. Also, the activities aren't limited to sports; some clubs organize bars of the month, get togethers at neighborhood fests, concerts, theatrical plays, etc.

But let's get back to the snow and slopes. I fell in love with skiing back when I pretty much had to ski alone. Most of my friends didn't ski, and those that did couldn't afford ski trips. My ski trips out west were done on my own, and when I finally mastered a run without falling there wasn't anyone to pat me on the back and congratulate me.

Ski and snowboard clubs changed that. Whether you're a novice or accomplished, there's plenty of camaraderie to share the highs (a great run) and the lows (a spectacular wipeout). If you have a significant other and you're not at the same ability level, you can spend a couple of hours on the same runs together, and then meet up with others in the club and split into groups of similar abilities. Likewise, if it's improvement you're after, there are bound to be some club members that are a little better than you, and one sure method of improving is the challenge to keep up.

Ski and snowboard clubs also may get you to that area you never heard about, or that area you didn't think you'd ever get

to. Many of our clubs look for some out-of-the-way or off-thebeaten-path areas to visit; a few years from now those areas will start getting some publicity and you'll be able to say you were there back in the day.

Another magical aspect of snowboard and ski clubs is the trip cost. Our clubs book their trips getting group rates on airfare, ground transportation, lodging and lift tickets, something you can't do on your own. Also, the tour operators that get our business do so by keeping on top of what areas are offering specials, and who is looking to draw more business.

That doesn't mean our trips are necessarily cheaper than you can do on your own, but you'll probably get much nicer lodging that is closer to the lifts and nightlife for a price similar to what you would have paid on your own.

So think about it. If you've been skiing and snowboarding on your own you already know how much fun the sport is. Now try it with a group and discover the social aspect. It will increase the fun many times over.



Breckenridge Struts its Stuff

In Breckenridge's quest to "land" Chicago Week 2007, Andy Hatch, Vail Resorts Midwest Sales and Marketing Manager, extended an invite to the CMSC for a quick FAM trip to show off their resort and town. Several clubs that have participated on Chicago Week had representation on this trip. The trip participants were JoAnn Cleek - Duneland Ski Club, Cindy Berinti-Vondrasek - Nomads, Kevin Butchin - Sitzmark (IL) and myself John Kuhn - CMSC VP of Trips / Inland / Chicago Friars.

This was a short trip with the group flying out Sunday morning, March 6th, and returning home Tuesday evening, March 8th. The group traveled on United Airlines flying from Chicago O'Hare to Denver International Airport. Ground transportation was provided by Colorado Mountain Express (CME - www.cmex.com).

Colorado Mountain Express dropped us off at the front steps of the Great Divide Lodge (www.greatdividelodge.com) where we were staying. After checking in we did a quick change into ski clothes and met Eddie McGuigan from Breckenridge Group Sales (www.breckenridge.snow.com). Eddie skied with us giving us a tour of Peaks 9 & 10. We skied mostly intermediate runs with Eddie pointing out the variety of terrain offered on these two peaks.

After skiing we met with Julie Chandler, National Sales Manager for Breckenridge Lodging & Hospitality (www.breckresorts.com). Julie took the group on a tour of the Village at Breckenridge showing us a number of different style lodging units and the conference space and meeting rooms that could be available for the Chicago Week activities. All of the units were spacious and well appointed. We stopped at Park Avenue Pub located in the lower level of Village at Breck's Village Hotel to share some appetizers and drinks before heading back to our rooms.

For dinner we took the Great Divide's shuttle service to Blue River Bistro located on Main Street in downtown Breckenridge where we were met by Lindsey Gillion of Breckenridge Group Sales and Eddie McGuigan, who were our hosts for dinner. The food and service were outstanding. Blue River Bistro is one of the more popular dining locations so reservations are highly recommended.

Monday morning had us doing site tours with Eric Anderson the Group Sale Coordinator for Resort Quest in Breckenridge (www.resortquestbreckenridge.com). The first property we toured was River Mountain Lodge, which is located across the street from the base of the Four O'Clock run and just steps from Main Street. It offers large, nicely

furnished hotel rooms, studios and 1, 2, 3 & 4 bedroom condos. Next we visited Main Street Station located on Main Street with the base of the QuickSilver chair lift just off the back of the complex. This is a new complex offering very nice 2 & 3 bedroom condos. One Breck Place, Park Place and Cimarron were next. These are all condo/town home properties located just about one block from Main Street and one to two blocks from the lifts. They were all very spacious and well appointed.

It was now time to ski and check out Peaks 7 & 8. Our guides for the afternoon were Julie Chandler and Brooke Roberts. Brooke works for the Breckenridge Convention & Visitors Bureau (www.breckenridgecvb.com) and has lived in the Chicago area in the past. The first hour or so was spent skiing Peak 8 then we stopped for lunch at the Vista Haus. After lunch Brooke lead the group over to Peak 7 while Julie and myself headed up the T-bar for a run down Horseshoe Bowl. By the time Julie and I met back up with the others, Cindy and JoAnn had big smiles on their faces. They were having a blast skiing the long, rolling intermediate cruisers on Peak 7. We skied as long as we could catching our last chair as they started to flip up the chair lift seats. I think we all discovered that Breckenridge is a cruisers paradise, with lots of long, groomed intermediate runs.

Julie and Brooke were our hosts for dinner at an Irish pub named Burke & Riley's Pub. The pub offers traditional American fare along with their Irish specialties. After a very filling dinner we were taken on a quick driving tour of town with stops at the town ice rink and the town recreation center. We decided to stop off for a nightcap at Fatty's before calling it a night. Fatty's is owned and operated by a Chicago area native with much of the décor dedicated to the Chicago sports teams.

Breckenridge has changed quite a bit over the last three or four years. If you haven't been there recently I think you would be pleasantly surprised if you went there again. Two of the major improvements to the ski area were installing the Independence chair to open Peak 7 to lift served skiing and adding the Peak 8 Super Connect chair. The Super Connect chair eliminates the need to ride several chairs to get to Peaks 8 & 7. This chair goes from the bottom of Peak 9 to the top of Peak 8. Breckenridge has also received the required permits to install a chair lift to the summit of Peak 8. This chair would provide lift service to Imperial Bowl, North Bowl and easier access to Peak 7 Bowl opening up a vast expanse of above tree line bowl skiing. The date for installing this chair has not been determined yet, but everyone is hoping it will be installed in time for the 2006/2007 ski season. Vail Resorts needs to work out the financial end of it now that the permits have been granted.




Atilla Donmez Finishes in the Top 10!

Road Trip March 2005

The 1930s saw a significant interest in skiing in the United States with ski areas showing up almost any-

where that there was snow. By 1938, many areas had rope tows and Sun Valley even had a chair lift. While some ski areas have become giant commercial enterprises others remain basically true to their original character, a good place to ski. New Mexico has many examples such ski areas. Skier satisfaction is high but condo sales and expensive shops are for somewhere else.

In the 30s, New Mexico saw a number of developments including, Santa Fe Mountain, Los Madre Ski Area on Sandia Peak in Albuquerque, Sawyer Hill in Los Alamos and of course Taos. Taos is known by many, but the other ski areas of New Mexico also have a unique and interesting history. Over the years we have made a number of trips to New Mexico and we have always found it to be somewhat special and closer to the heart of skiing (without a lot of the glitz and glamour). This is "old school skiing" Many of the people that ski and work there have been here for 20, 30, 40 years and more. Personnel working at an area 20 years ago are still there and the loyalty of the public goes even further. With many the faces that we know at Aspen, or Vail changing every three to four years it is very interesting to find slope managers that have a 30 year history at one location or a ski school instructor that is 82 years old and helped to develop the area.



On March 1, 2005, we were searching snow and we noticed that both Pajarito and Sandia were reporting great snow on their websites. In spite of many trips to New Mexico, we have never made it to Pajarito. A road trip was in order for three of the lesser known ski areas of New Mexico, Pajarito, Sandia and Apache. Why, you ask?

As for Pajarito Mountain, when the scientists, engineers and technicians arrived in Los Alamos, New Mexico, in 1943, the locals were already skiing at Sawyer Hill. At the time there was also good skiing at nearby Sandia and at Santa Fe. As the Los Alamos community developed and scientific labs became permanent, the Los Alamos Ski Club located to the higher mountain peak where the snow was better and the conditions for skiing were ideal. The Los Alamos Ski Club bought and cleared the land, installed lifts, ran the ski area and even sold food, mostly with volunteers. The area was also open to the public. When they needed money to purchase lifts or to buy more land, they raised it. The ski area is now operated and managed by paid staff but, volunteers from the club still make it the place that it is; a unique and interesting place with a reputation for good and challenging skiing.



The ski area is located just west of Los Alamos about an hour from Santa Fe. The area is open on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and on Holidays. The runs drop down Pajartio Mountain from a long ridge. Several chairs take you from bottom to top quickly and

there are no lift lines. Catwalks and trails let you traverse easily from one side to the other. The runs are some of the most challenging runs in New Mexico. Although the area only has a 1000' vertical, it takes most of a day to ski every run and it is easy to accumulate 20000 feet of skiing in 6 hours. Doing every run may start with skiing from top to bottom on green runs that are groomed and steep. The blue runs, some groomed and some with



bumps, are black diamond at other ski areas. The green and blue runs allow for high speed cruising with rolling drops. The black and double black runs are designed to challenge. The moguls that form are big and tight and require expert technique and stamina. The tree runs are epic adventures. By the time we had skied most of the runs, we found double black bump runs at the end of the day a little too much.


The Base Lodge, is your basic day lodge with a respectable food service. The green chile is interesting and worth at taste. It is just a few steps up from the parking lot and the lodge is decorated with a detailed and colorful history of skiing and the Los Alamos Ski Club.

Sandia Peak rises above the city of Albuquerque to 11000 feet. The west face is an abrupt cliff but the east side is a gradual tree covered slope. The winter storms roll across the New Mexican



desert and are forced to climb over the peaks at Albuquerque, Santa Fe, Toas and Ruidosa. When they do, they drop snow on the eastern side. The city of Albuquerque discovered this. Albuquerque is the airport that everyone flies into. The Los Madre ski area developed in 1937. Most of us move on directly to Toas and miss the opportunity to ski Sante Fe, Pajarito or Sandia. To ski Sandia, one can drive around

the mountain to the base area on the east side of the mountain or take the short ride up to the tram located at the west base of the mountain in Albuquerque (the town lift). The ski area is open Wednesday through Sunday, however the tram operates year round and provides access to a mountain top restaurant and to spectacular views of Albuquerque and New Mexico that make it a year round tourist attraction. Many of the town people use the tram for easy access to the top of the ski area or just return from work at the end of the day. To go continued on page 47






CHICAGO WEEK 2005 to Banff

SKI FOR LIGHT NURTURES AND INSPIRES

When Ivonne Mosquera leaves her work as a direct marketing coordinator for the American Civil Liberties Union, she dawns a pair of running shoes and heads out on a four to ten mile run. Ivonne suffered cancer in her retinas (retinoblastoma) as a baby, and is totally blind. Ivonne runs with a guide and participated in the 2003 New York City Marathon, followed by the Chicago Marathon a year later. It was no surprise Ivonne expressed interest in learning to cross-country ski when a friend from the Achilles Track Club told her about Ski for Light (SFL).

"As I solidified my plans to attend Ski for Light, I was definitely looking forward to a much needed vacation," recalls Ivonne. "But I was also a bit apprehensive about my choice. I had never cross-country skied and really had no idea how it all worked." Ivonne was also apprehensive about being in such a large group of nearly 300 people. "Would I be embarrassed about getting lost in the unfamiliar surroundings, or about walking into another cane or guide dog user?" Ivonne smiled. "My fears were instantly put to rest when I was greeted by the SFL volunteers. When I was told that I would be receiving help from someone to find my room, I felt a sense of relief wash over me, and just knew that the rest of the week would be fine."

After a few essentials, such as finding the hot tub, Ivonne was ready to focus on learning how to cross country ski. She was matched with veteran guide John Amundson of Marshall, Minnesota, and first-time guide Suzanne Kingsbury of Brattleboro, Vermont. The three quickly became friends. "I could not have been luckier," says Ivonne. "John and Suzanne are incredibly bright, accomplished, funny and caring individuals. It was thrilling and inspiring to see how excited and willing they were to teach me how to ski."



"In Ivonne I found a long lost sister and a mentor in life," smiles Suzanne. "Although she had never cross country skied before, she was fearless and beat her own time again and again." John readily echoed this sentiment when asked about skiing with Ivonne, "her concentration, athleticism and desire to learn how to ski was so inspiring!"

After the first day Ivonne's muscles let her know she had worked out quite a bit. "I remember getting back to my room and taking an hour nap!" The next day Ivonne was ready and excited to learn how to kick after each stride and how to switch between sets of tracks. "As the week progressed, I found myself wanting to ski more and more, and my distance also increased rapidly!"

Off the snow Ivonne enjoyed what she called "behind the scenes" activities. She spent time laughing, dancing and even doing Karaoke with other participants. "I learned so much about life, and about myself in just a week," reflects Ivonne. "The experience has really touched me and changed me to my core. I was in an environment in which I didn't have to think about my blindness but could relax and be myself."

The 31st annual Ski for Light International Week will be held in Granby, Colorado from January 29 through February 5, 2006. Participants will stay at the Inn at Silver Creek and ski each day at Snow Mountain Ranch, the "YMCA of the Rockies." The organization is always seeking new guides and participants. Like Ivonne, word-of-mouth is how most first-time attendees are introduced to the program. Information about and application forms for the 2006 event are available at www.sfl.org. TAOS FAM TRIP WITH SPORTOURS

January 5-9, 2005 By Blaze

On Wednesday, January 5th, 12 skiers (snowboarders are not yet able to enjoy Taos' runs) were to meet Joel Hoffman from Sportours for a trip to the Taos Ski Valley. Due to delays on some of our United flights, all of the participants did not arrive as scheduled in Albuquerque, NM. We waited at the airport for the rest of the flights to arrive and when we were informed that the remaining two participants would not arrive until that night, we left for The Inn At Snakedance (IAS) in one of the Inn's vans with our host Roger Mariani, the Inn's General Manager. The last two in our group did reach the resort very early the next morning, after arriving in Albuquerque and driving about three hours to the on-mountain resort. At the IAS, we each checked into one of its 60 rooms that sit at the base of the mountain, then gathered at the Hondo Bar in the IAS for cocktails before heading over to Rhoda's, a restaurant located next door, for an excellent dinner. There we met another of our hosts, Chris Stagg, the VP of Marketing for Taos Ski Valley (TSV).

The next morning started with a full breakfast which was included in our room package. Afterward, we headed out to the fresh snow and the lifts which were only yards away and/or took advantage of the world famous Ernie Blake Ski School. For years, this school has been listed at or near the top of ski school rating lists. There are specials available during some weeks in January. If your group purchases 6 day lift packages, six two hour lessons are included for each participant.

This is an incredible value! After a great day of lessons and skiing we checked out the little bar at the St. Bernard next door.

at the Hondo Restaurant at the IAS. For you wine lovers, this restaurant has an award-winning wine list and has repeatedly received the "Wine Spectator Award Of Excellence". An interesting idea at this restaurant is the smaller portions available at very reasonable prices, so that diners can enjoy more than one entree or eat a lighter meal if they wish.

The next day dawned sunny, so after another great breakfast we headed for the slopes and/or lessons. We only skied until around 12:30 because we were moving to the Fechin Inn (FI) in the town of Taos. On the way to our new accommodations, we stopped at the Rio Grande Gorge and then the Taos Pueblo (fee) which has been continuously inhabited for over 1000 years! Native artists live and work in the pueblo, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a National Historical Landmark. From there we continued on to the 84 room FI, a Southwestern style luxury property located on the estate of Russian-born artist and woodcarver Nicolai Fechin, who moved to Taos in 1927. That evening we had dinner at the Purple Rose at the Quail Ridge Inn which is a short drive outside of Taos and then stopped in for the live entertainment at the Taos Inn.

Saturday morning we awoke to more fresh snow and after the continental breakfast headed to the mountain about a half hour away. After our morning lesson, we free skied the rest of our last day. In the evening before dinner, some of us toured the town of Taos. After dinner at the FI, a story teller in the lobby entertained us with her interesting stories for about an hour and a half.

Sunday morning was clear and sunny for the trip back to the airport and home. After breakfast we started back to Albuquerque, stopping in Santa Fe on the way. Not much was open that early on a Sunday morning, except churches, hotels and the markets. The city has interesting architecture and is worth spending the time to explore.

The TSV base is at 9207'. Lift service goes to 11819'. Skiers can hike up to 12481' on Kachina Peak. This gives verticals of 2612' and 3274' respectively. TSV averages over 300" of annual snowfall on its' 110 runs (24% beginner, 25% intermediate, 51% expert) which are served by 12 lifts. TSV has rental equipment available and of course that world famous ski school including telemark instruction. If you can not come out during ski season, other activities include golf, rafting, riding, ballooning, hiking, biking and fishing. For more information contact:

Agony of defeat? Not in Illinois!

For almost thirty years ABC's Wide World of Sports was preferred viewing for American sports enthusiasts. Couch potatoes around the country sat in the comfort of their form fitting barca loungers, gobbling snacks and sucking suds while watching the weekly death defying crash of Slovenian ski jumper Vinko Bogataj, dubbed "The agony of defeat". Bogataj was competing as a (then) Yugoslav entrant at the World Ski Flying Championships in Oberstdorf Germany (then West Germany) on March 21, 1970. A light snow had begun falling at the start of the event, and by the time Bogataj was ready for his third jump, the snow had become quite heavy. Midway down the ramp for that jump, Bogataj realized that the conditions had deteriorated greatly. At this point he was committed to his destiny. He attempted to lower his center of gravity and safely complete his jump despite conditions, but instead lost his balance completely and rocketed out of control off the end of the ramp, tumbling and flipping wildly and crashing through a light retaining fence near a crowd of stunned spectators before coming to a halt. Fortunately - and surprisingly, given the ferocity of the crash, Bogataj suffered only a mild concussion. He returned to ski jumping the next year, but never duplicated the success he had before the crash and retired from the sport competitively.

It is likely that Vinko Bogataj's crash would have remained an obscure sports legend had a film crew from the American sports televsion show ABC's Wide World of Sports not been on hand to record the event. The show featured an opening narration (by host Jim McKay) over a montage of sports clips, and starting from then, coordinating producer Dennis Lewin inserted the footage of Bogataj's tremendous tumble to coin-

cide with the words "...and the agony of defeat!" Throughout the show's long history, various images were used for the other parts of the narration, including for "The thrill of victory...", which directly proceeded the above phrase and was often accompanied by images of the celebrating team at the most recent Super Bowl or Football World Cup. But for those many years after that point, the "agony of defeat" was always illustrated by Bogataj's failed jump.

The melodrama of the narration, which became something of a catch phrase in the U.S., and the sympathetic pain of watching Bogataj wipe out week after week, transformed the uncred-



ited ski jumper into an American icon of unluck and misfortune. Meanwhile, having retired to his quiet, private life in Slovenia, Vinko Bogataj was unaware of his celebrity and so, was quite confused to be asked to attend an anniversary celebration for Wide World of Sports in 1991. He was stunned when the other, more famous athletes present, such as Muhammad Ali, asked him for his autograph. While traveling to the anniversary, Bogataj was involved in a car crash and was heard saying "Every time I am on ABC, I crash". Vinko's popularity in the US may have been equalled by only one other unlikely ski jumping legend.

home it is only necessary to be on the last chair up and then ride the tram back down to your car. There is no ski facility at the top of the area; those riding the tram must have their ski equipment with them (or rent in town).

Sandia is not the most challenging; most of the runs are easy



greens or blues. The runs carve down through the forest and occasionally open up into broad meadows. There is plenty of room for beginners. It is a good place to learn to ski or board and it is a great family ski area. All of the runs lead back to the base lodge. The ski area caters to beginners and families. In addition to putting water out on picnic tables, Sandia also puts out large containers of sun screen. Most days, sun screen is necessary.

Look for Ski Apache on Sierra Blanco Mountain in the heart of Billy the Kid country. It is located in Ruidosa, New Mexico just two hours north of El Paso Texas and about three hours south of One would hardly expect to find a 12000 foot peak this far south. And the skiing is great! The ski area and several nearby casinos are owned and operated by the Mescalero Apache Reservation. The parking lot sees a lot Texas license plates and the area is a favorite of skiers from Mexico. The ski area did not develop until the 60s, possibly because of the difficulty in getting a road up to it. The drive up is interesting and would be a real challenge in bad weather but you want to be skiing here after it has been snowing. We encountered some of the best skiing that we have seen in New Mexico only two hours north of the US border. Morning found heavy snow conditions and poor visibility. We skied the runs in the trees and skied pretty much blind. Around 11:00 the storm broke up and we found every kind of powder. Although the chair lifts sometimes stop

and are a little slow, the skiing is worth the wait. The four person gondola is an antique. It is the only one in New Mexico and some of the cars are held together with bailing wire, but it gets you to the top in 12 minutes. The top part of the ski area, at 10,400 feet, provides a spectacular view down into White Sands over a mile lower. On a great day the powder is deep and there are endless choices of untracked runs in the upper bowl. The bowl served by its own chair and many skiers see the lower mountain only at the end of the day.

There is no lodging on mountain but there are several choices of places to eat and drink at the base area. The drive off mountain is the typical rat race that many ski areas have but is complicated by tighter turns, blind cor-

ners and the perception of that a license plate from Texas gives some sort of invulnerability.

The town of nearby Ruidosas is very laid back. Gambling and horse racing are the big draws in the summer. There are plenty of motels and restaurants and a casino or two. On a Saturday night in March we found that many bars and restaurants close at 9:00PM. We never did figure out where the nightspots were.

Over the years, we have developed a number of friendships in New Mexico, mostly at ski areas. It is nice to know that many of those we have met will still be there next year and the year after. Skiing in New Mexico is something of a hidden secret. Everyone knows about Taos but there is exceptional skiing at Santa Fe and there is a reason why Red River is popular with skiers from Oklahoma and Texas. We have been to Apache twice and the snow was excellent. Ski areas like Parajito, and Sandia are regional favorites with lift ticket prices that are easy on pocketbook and parking lots that are 100 yards from the lifts. There is always snow somewhere in New Mexico and sometimes the snow is better than Colorado.

Of course it helps to be lucky. If you have our luck you will discover great skiing and find long lasting friendships in New & Mexico. LWM & TW

continued from page 44 Michael **Edwards** (born December 1963), better known as Eddie 'the Eagle' Edwards, was the first competitor to represent Great Britain in Olympic Ski jumping. Edwards was born in Cheltenham and was working as a plasterer when he qualified for the 1988 Winter Olympics ski-jump competition. He qualified simply because no other Briton applied. He was handicapped by his weight, about 82 kg (180 pounds), more than 9kg (20 pounds) heavier than the next heaviest competitor. Another problem was that his glasses fogged to such an extent that he could not see. However, his evident courage, his irreverent character, and his lack of success warmed people to him all across the globe. The worse he did, the more popular he became. He declared bankruptcy in 1992, claiming a trust fund set up to handle his earnings was not done so properly. He is now a law student at De Montfort University in Leicester. In March 2002, the exclusive film and TV rights to Eddie's story were purchased by an American production company. It is said that Edwards will perform some of the ski-jumps in the movie.

The Eddie 'The Eagle' Rule

In response to the Edwards phenomenon, in 1990 the International Olympic Committee (IOC) instituted what became known as the Eddie the Eagle Rule, which requires Olympic hopefuls to compete in international events and place in the top 30 percent or the top 50 competitors.

These two unknowns are now etched in the memories of millions of sports fans in the United States and around the globe. Many feel that they gave ski jumping a bad rap and portrayed it as a sport for lunitics and fools but the reality is that they both helped to put ski jumping on the front page. Throughout the thirty years of watching ABC and seeing jumping on every opener, there was really only limited ski jumping broadcasted for Americans.

Illinois fans have enjoyed the luxury of watching exciting world class competitions right in their back yard at the Norge Ski Club venue in Fox River Grove. This improbable location is one of the crown jewels in US ski jumping attracting over five thousand spectators to last years 100th anniversary competition. On hand for the event were Olympic silver medalist Bill Kidd, and Leif Hovelson, 84 year old son of Norge Ski Club founder Carl Hovelson. Carl also founded ski jumping in Colorado's Steamboat Springs area later around 1912. The crowd was treated to high flying action culminating with an amazing 243 foot leap and new hill record by Barrington's Kyle Lockhart.

Before downhill skiing became a popular participant sport following World War II, most people's familiarity with skiing was tied to jumping. The Norge Ski Club in Fox River Grove, one of the oldest ski clubs in the world, helped to bring visibility of the sport to the Chicago area. In 1939, and again in 1954, temporary jumps towering high over the stadiums columns were

erected in Soldier Field, now the home of the Chicago Bears. They were "snowed" with shaved ice. Those events are still talked about as being "the most dangerous sporting events ever held in soldier field".

This sport's American roots go back to the 1880s, and it began in the midwest ... places like Red Wing, St Paul and Eau Claire. Some of these clubs date back to the 1880s! The first recorded North American distance record was set in 1887 by Mikkel Hemmestvedt. He flew 37 feet! Incredible and unbelievable distances are now being recorded on huge jumps in Europe called "ski flying" hills. Last years event delivered the promise of a new world record when Norwegian jumper Bjoern-Einar Romoeren flew an astounding 239 meters in one mighty leap, landing at the very bottom of the jump hill. For those of you not familiar with the metric conversion, that calculates out to 784 feet. That is equivilent to more than two and a half football fields. Now that's incredible!

Safety first. With video clips like the crash of Vinko Bogataj, fans are under the impression that ski jumping is one of the more dangerous sports that one could compete in. In fact, there are very few injuries resulting from ski jumping. Jumpers often start at the ripe old age of five or six, although many great jumpers started out in their teens. A handful of adults join the masters league every year and take their first jumps off smaller hills until they get their "wings". Norge is the perfect place to get a start in ski jumping whether young or old. The Norge Ski Training Center (NSTC), a not for profit 501c3 organization, was officially formed just a few short years ago and has had dramatic success sending many jumpers to compete in National Junior Olympic competitions as well as international events. Norge is a member of the Central division of the United States Ski and Snowboard Assn. along with fifteen other clubs in the Midwest Central Division, the USSA also includes other divisions across the country. Some of the better known clubs residing at Olympic venues like Park City, Utah and Lake Placid, New York.

Even though most of these clubs are better funded and recognized, it was the Norge Ski Club that was named by the USSA as domestic ski jumping club of the year for the 2003-2004 season. The head coach of the clubs program, Scott Smith, has a long list of credits including coaching the US Olympic team and being named domestic ski jumping coach of the year for two of the last three years by the USSA. This recognition by our national governing body underscores the commitment and dedication of the clubs members to continue the one hundred year tradition well in to the future. The clubs commitment to the sport and their venue was highlighted in 2003 when a new and larger jump was built giving the club a total of five jumps from five meters for the little tykes up to the new seventy two meter hill for the experts. Three of these hills, including the k20, k45, and k72 are all fitted with plastic landing surfaces allowing for jump training in both summer and winter.



Skunk Hollow Ski and Snowboard Club

So, if you're the type who likes to sit at home, watch TV, or just take a nap...don't bother with us!! We want you if you're




